



The Village of Philmont Historic District is well on its way to be nominated to the NY State and National Registers of Historic Places 2 Public presentations

PHILMONT RISING



The Agawamuck Creek Watershed is approximately 14,656 acres (22.9 sq miles) consisting of the Agawamuck Creek, Summit Lake, the Philmont Reservoir, and their tributaries.

The Agawamuck Creek Watershed Management Plan is a Village of Philmont & PBI inter-municipal project collaborating with the Towns of Claverack, Ghent, Hillsdale, and Austerlitz aimed at creating a plan to improve and protect the watershed and the Agawamuck Creek that flows

Summit Lake and High Falls as a part of the Hudson River Estuary.


ACCOMPLISHED?

The Watershed Advisory Committee was formed with the participating towns of Claverack, Ghent, Hillsdale, and Austerlitz.

The project website was established.

LaBella Associates was selected through a competitive process to be hired as the watershed planning consultant firm to start in 2023 working with PBI and the participating communities who care about the environment of the watershed and the Agawamuck Creek.

<u>Annabel's Victory Garden</u>, located at the back of the Philmont Co-op is a PBI project created and operated by PBI as a teaching garden for kids and families and is a part of our Local Food program.

Lead Gardener, Taylor Kurtz, is growing the garden beautifully to

meet the PBI's Kids Grow & Cook program vision including the continuation of the garden's weekly free harvesting to the community.

WHAT WAS ACCOMPLISHED?

Annabel's Victory Garden 18 raised beds produced its 3rd year of growing for the community in partnership with the Philmont Library and the Sylvia Center.

The garden produced over 15 bags of mixed produce free harvests every Wednesday, helping 15 families meet their fresh veggie food needs.

We started the At Home program providing 2 local families with free raised beds, soil testing, bed soils and compost. The families were provided at home gardening instruction from Taylor Kurtz, our gardener, to assist with learning how to grow and pollinate.

SMALL BUSINESS



Engaging the Philmont Co-op management and Board in a 10-month dialogue to improve the Co-op capability to meet the PBI grant requirements for the 2016 state investment made to revitalize 116 Main St. as a local food system. It provides local Producers and farmers with opportunities to serve the community as members of the Cooperative as the anchor tenant. This dialogue will continue into early 2023 through a proposed mediation.
