Annabel's Victory Garden began in 2013 as a Girl Scouts Gold Award project by Annabel O'Neill, a 14 year old resident of the Village. That summer, she built four small planting beds and ran weekly workshops teaching kids how to grow and cook. That 1st garden season finished with a large free community dinner held on the parking lot to celebrate Annabel's seasonal success for her project. At that time, PBI and the Co-op made a commitment to her that we would take on expanding the garden as a part of the extensive PBI redevelopment of the Co-op facility, the commercial kitchen and the site renovations. From that summer going forward PBI started our Kids Grow & Cook program held every summer, steadily building partner relations and a track record for funding free food programs offered to kids and families in the village.

Fast forward to the spring of 2020 and the Covid pandemic. It was time for the next phase for Annabel's Garden and the time was right to fulfill our promise to Annabel by creating a Victory Garden to meet the challenges of Covid and our collective belief that access to local and healthy foods for all must be a right, not a privilege, in order to ensure vibrant, healthy, and diverse communities achieve a strengthening of health equity and local resiliency.

We've taken our lead from Annabel's journals and workshops to create a teaching garden for kids & families continuing her vision! We hope you will enjoy it and become involved.
